- The **stability** of assessment funding has allowed multi-year projects

Auburn Farmers Market

King CD provided a grant for **\$86,000** to the City of Auburn to make the Auburn International Farmers Market possible. The farmers market helps to support local farmers, provides residents with locally grown produce and has contributed to downtown revitalization.

"The King CD grant program gave life to a long time dream for the Auburn, Algona and Pacific communities," said Lillie Brinker, Manager of the Auburn market.

Middle Green River Restoration

King CD's grant program is helping King County restore portions of three sites on the middle Green River: Whitney Park Bridge, Kanaskat Natural Area and Gary Grant Soos Creek Park. Funding totaling over **\$57,000** has covered site preparation, planting of 7,500 native plants and ongoing maintenance to ensure the survival of the new plantings (a cost often not covered by other grant funding sources).
