- Estimate gutter and downspout needs for barns

- Develop a manure composting and utilization plan
- Estimate the volume of manure produced by livestock
- Design livestock manure storage compost bins
- Develop a compost spreading plan

- Develop a pasture management plan
- Determine the grazing capacity of pasture
- Learn to manage grazing for optimal pasture production
