Be a Detective

- **Soil**
- **Light**
- **Water**



Full Sun – Minimum of 6 hours direct sunlight

Part Sun – 3 to 6 hours direct sun

Part Shade – Emphasis on shade in afternoon

Full shade – Less than 3 hours direct sun

**Some plants prefer more sun,
others prefer more shade**



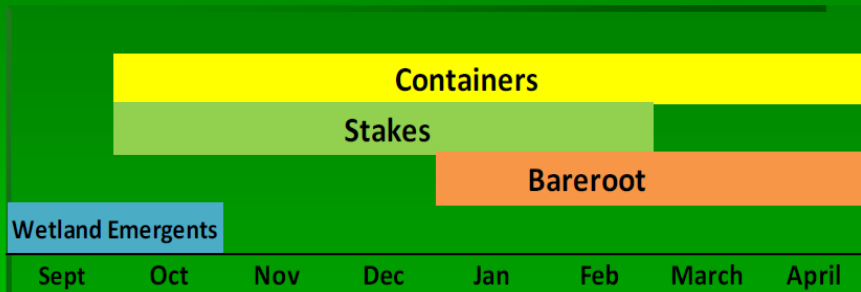

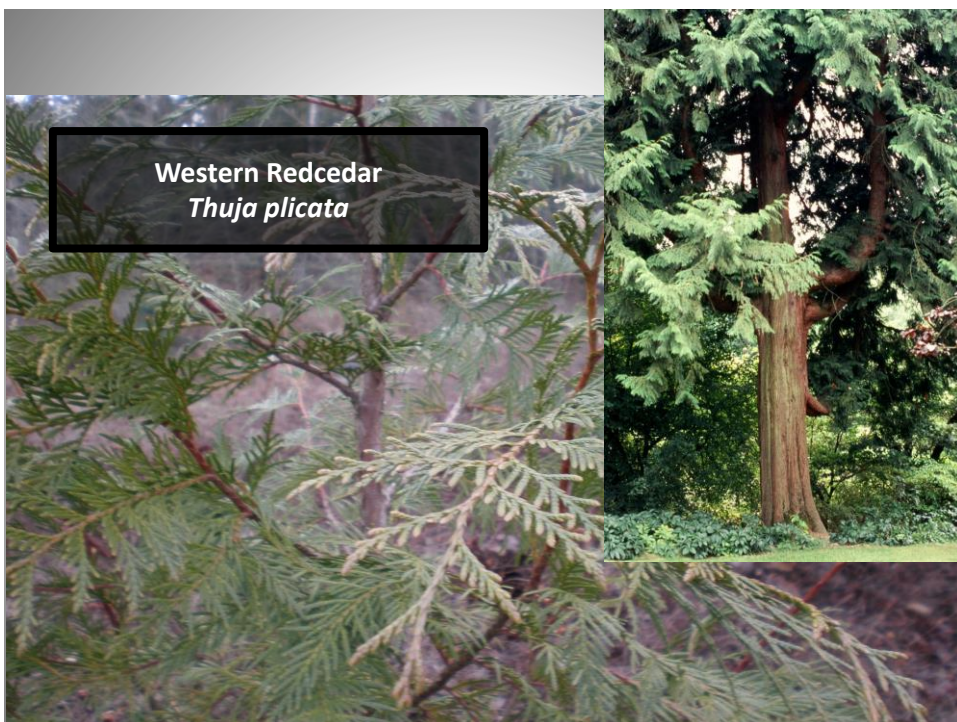
