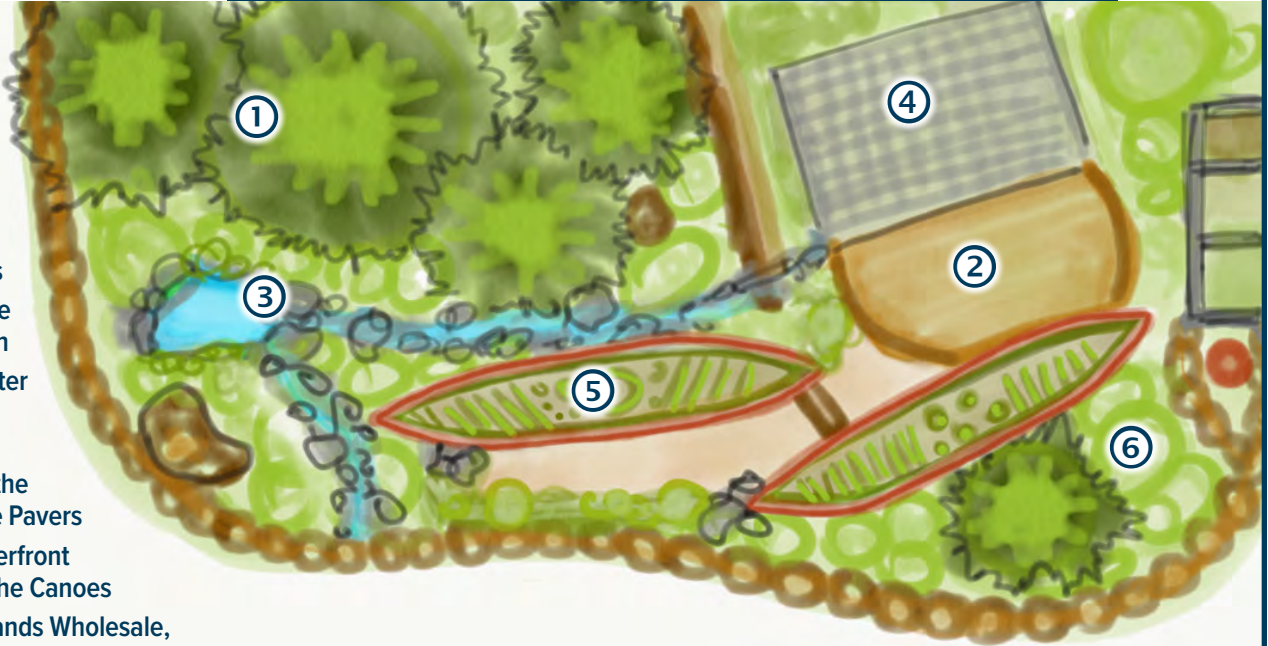


ORCA RECOVERY GARDEN
